What every summary of a binding document carries

"This summary does not replace the document; read it before signing." — at the head, in bold, with the full document attached.

Outcome despite the line	Contracts
Document opened in full before signature	4
Signed without opening the document	3

A warning read a hundred times stops being read. That is true of every banner, and the agent has no reason to be the exception — saying so is better than adding a

second warning.

What is proposed, and what it is not

Proposal	Is it a block?
The summary opens alongside the document, never alone	No
An "I have read" tick-box	Not proposed
A second warning	Not proposed

What stays guaranteed, whatever happens

What the agent does	What it spares you
Every contract is summarised, including the ones signed in a hurry	A 60-page contract left unsummarised is skimmed

Which is worse, because nobody knows what was skipped.
