Every visitor sends their IP address and current page to three companies with no connection to the business. None of it is visible on screen.

Why this happens with nobody deciding it

Step	What happens
Official documentation gives an example	It points at a third-party server
The example works immediately	No reason to look further
The local alternative	Three more lines, which nobody writes

What the agent now does

Action	Done?
Write code calling an external domain	No
Supply the local version	Yes
Say what it costs	Yes — a few KB to host, an update to do yourself
Remove the three existing ones	No — the replacement is supplied, ready
