The 32 complete applications — what each sheet carries

Element of the sheet	What it contains	Why it is there
Child's identity and date of birth	Surname, first name, date of birth, matching room	Determines the room open to the application
Filing date of the application	Date of registration at the single desk	Age-of-application criterion, art. 3.5
Points in detail, line by line	Each criterion, its article, its points, and the dated document that grounds it	This is what makes the scoring explainable to a parent
Care needs requested	Days, hours, desired start date	Set against the slots actually available
Situation note	Sourced elements useful to the deliberation, with no appraisal by the agent	On files level on points, this is what informs the panel
Movement history	Entry on the list, changes of points, earlier hold-overs, with date, reason and author	Answers the question « why did my position change »

These six files are the best demonstration of what the agent brings, and of what it leaves. It brings: six complete, sourced sheets, with the history of every movement and the document behind every point — **work that used to take several hours and that is done. It leaves:** the choice. **On these six files no position is proposed — this is exactly where the panel does something no scoring grid replaces**, and it is also what makes its decision explainable to a parent.
