Division of roles

Act	Who performs it	The AI agent
Settling a date in a situation	The registry, under the oversight and decisions of the judicial authority	Never — it copies the settled date across with its document
Deciding	The judicial authority	Never
Notifying	The facility director	Never — it prepares the document

Act	Who performs it	The AI agent
Signing off a document before issue	The head of registry	Prepares and submits for sign-off
Making an entry in the register	A named registry officer	Prepares the entry, does not make it
Clearing a flag	An officer holding the delegation	Opens the line, does not close it
Requesting a document from a court	The head of registry, or an officer mandated in writing	Drafts, does not send without a mandate

Item supplied	Form	What is never added
Every document where the date appears	In order of receipt	—
The exact wording	Copied word for word	No rewording
The recounted gaps	In days	No conclusion
The missing documents	With the court to approach	—
The applicable in-house notes	Reference, date, passage reproduced	No summary, no interpretation

Why the agent stops there: a date in a criminal situation bears on the lawfulness of the detention. **A tool that produced it would create a second source, and the day the two diverged nobody would know which prevails. It is the one case where two answers are worth less than none.**

Date of the flag	Reconstructing the order of events
Document that triggered it	Going back to the original
Officer who cleared it	Knowing who verified, and under what delegation
Action taken	Distinguishing a cleared flag from a closed one
