Fictional document — demonstration example

This document is produced by the Blue Lemon Agent website to illustrate what an AI agent hands to its users. The companies, matters, amounts and people in it are invented. It has no legal, accounting or commercial value.

Fictional document, produced for the demonstration. **A registry handles procedural documents and the identities of parties, some of it covered by secrecy. The architecture must be checkable, not promised — and the scope must be proven, not declared.**

Two architectures to choose from, and you decide which

The most important line in this table is the last column of the « procedural documents » row. Preparing a summons, a notification or an entry requires **identifying elements**; it never requires reading what the parties argue. **The scope announced — administrative support, no involvement in the merits — therefore has a technical translation, and it is that translation that can be verified: article 5.1(c) of the GDPR asks for nothing else.**

The scope is proven — what the log shows

The Annex III question of the European AI Regulation, asked plainly. Point 8 of Annex III covers systems intended to **assist a judicial authority in researching and interpreting facts and the law and in applying the law to a concrete set of facts. The answer is not argued, it is shown:** the agent prepares procedural acts from **your templates**, logs time limits **carried by acts**, and keeps **registers**. **None of these tasks touches the research or interpretation of the law. The scope is written into the contract, it is held by the access rights, and it can be checked on the log** — all three, because a clause alone proves nothing. **This paragraph is written to be reread by your lawyer and your court president, and discussed with them at design stage.**

The right of access — what is ready, and the question that is yours

The access file is produced in a minute: identity on the file, acts served and their dates, entries made, time limits logged, **and the log of the reads made of the file with their purpose. That is the right of access under article 15 of the GDPR; its exercise over processing connected with judicial activity is assessed under the rules specific to such processing — the question is settled with your data protection officer and your court president, not by the tool. What the tool brings is that the usual difficulty — assembling the material — no longer exists: it is already assembled, and the decision to act on it is entirely yours.**
